2to4. Applicant/accused Muhammad Ayoub son of Sohrab Zardari is present in person and submits that he has not engaged counsel and intends to argue the matter himself. He seeks transfer of Criminal Case No. 284 of 2025 (Re: State v. Muhammad Ayoub and others) from the Court of the learned Judicial Magistrate-I, Nawabshah, to any other learned Judicial Magistrate at District Hyderabad. He asserts that he is aggrieved by the persistent directions allegedly issued in Court requiring him to amicably settle the matter with the complainant party. He further submits that the complainant party has been threatening him. Lastly, he contends that although the matter was initiated against him in June, 2025, it remains at the stage of evidence almost a year later, with prosecution witnesses repeatedly called absent and no effective orders passed to compel their attendance.

Heard the applicant. I have perused the diary sheets and noted the contentions raised. However, the certified copies of the orders/diary reflect a different scenario. Prosecution witnesses have been in attendance, although some have not appeared. Yet for those remaining absent non-bailable warrants have been issued against them. The learned Presiding Officer is attending to the matter in the usual course. In view of the circumstances of the case, no grounds for

transfer is made out, as the ingredients of prejudice and/or bias are missing from this application.

Given the above, I find no justification to order transfer of Criminal Case No. 284 of 2025 from the current trial Court, except to direct the learned Judicial Magistrate-I, Nawabshah, to continue to proceed with the matter diligently within the framework of the procedure to facilitate expeditious disposal of the case. With these observations, the Criminal Transfer Application is **dismissed** in limine in the above terms along with listed application.
