**Omar Sial, J.** Applicant Asjad, son of Khalid, seeks post-arrest bail in Crime No.207/2026 registered by PS Darakhshan under Section 397,34 PPC. The earlier bail application moved on behalf of the applicant was dismissed vide order dated 17.04.2026 by the learned IXth Additional Sessions Judge, Karachi (South).

2. The prosecution's case is that on 27.03.2026, at approximately 9:15 PM, the complainant, Bazil, was returning home on his motorcycle from his workplace. When he reached Main Khayaban Shaheen Crossing, Behria, Phase 05, DHA, Karachi, two unknown persons on a motorcycle accosted him. The pillion rider, at gunpoint, snatched a REDMI touchscreen mobile phone along with cash amounting to Rs. 30,000/-. The assailants fled the scene. A case was registered on the same day against unknown accused persons. The applicant, later that same day was arrested in another crime.

3. Learned counsel for the applicant argued that the applicant is innocent and has been falsely implicated in the case, which is opposed by learned DPG by contending that the applicant was apprehended at the place of the incident with the stolen articles in his possession. This recovery, she argued, established a strong prima facie case against the applicant.

4. Heard learned counsel for the applicant, learned DPG, as well as the complainant present in person. My observations and findings are as follows:

5. The complainant, a young, educated, and dignified young man, Bazil, has categorically and unequivocally stated that the applicant was the same person who, along with his accomplice, had robbed him of his mobile phone and cash at gunpoint on the night of the incident. The applicant and his co-accused were arrested on the day of the incident itself by the police of Darakhshan Station. The stolen mobile phone and cash were recovered from their possession. The applicant's learned counsel has been unable to identify any reason for Bazil to falsely accuse the applicant of robbing him. While dismissing the bail application, I have treated the exponential rise in street crime in the city as an exceptional and extraordinary ground. Reference in this regard may be made to Tariq Bashir and 5 others vs The State (PLD 1995 SC 34).

The bail application is dismissed.
