Omar Sial, J. A police party of the Shahrah-e-Noor Jahan, Karachi, police station, led by ASI Ali Abro, was on patrol duty when they signaled three people on a motorcycle to stop. The motorcyclists attempted to escape and the persons sitting at the back of the motorcycle opened fire on the police party. Two of the motorcyclists sustained the bullet injuries on their legs and as a motorcycle fell down all three were apprehended. They identified themselves as Saddam, Imtiaz and Zubair. The pistol was recovered from Saddam and Imtiaz for which they did not have license. The motorcyclists were also not able to produce ownership documents of a motorcycle. FIR No.203/2025 was registered under Sections 353, 324 and 34 PPC. A separate FIR bearing No.205/2025 was also registered against Imtiaz under Section 23(i)(a) of the Sindh Arms Act, 2013. Imtiaz seeks bail in both the crimes.

2. I have heard learned counsel for the applicant and the learned Deputy Prosecutor General Sindh.

3. The offence under Section 353 is bailable, whereas, at the moment, no police officer was injured, nor any vehicle or property damaged by Imtaiz's alleged firing, whether or not the ingredients of Section 324 PPC are satisfied will have to be determined after the evidence led at trial. A stereotyped story has been given by the police in which it is also claimed that indiscriminate firing was opened on the police, with the intention to kill them, yet inevitably it is only the accused who sustained bullet injuries on their legs by the police party, neither the mobile nor the adjoining property, whether the incident occurred inevitably remains undamaged and unheard. The case against the applicant is one of the further inquiry. He is admitted to post-arrest bail in both crimes. Above are the reasons of a short order dated 03.06.2026.
