Muhammad Ali Mazhar, J: This petition has been brought to challenge the order dated 26.04.2018 passed by the Election Commission of Pakistan, whereby, 29 representations regarding delimitation of constituencies in respect of district Nausheroferoze were decided through a consolidated order. The petitioner had also filed his representation and his name is appearing at Sr. No. 6 of the impugned order.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner referred to paragraph No. 4(viii) of the memo of petition. He argued that the preliminary delimitation of PS-34 failed to maintain the territorial unity of constituency between Tappa Luthi and

Tappa Mithiani as between these two Tappas PS-35 has been

inserted.

3. The representative of E.C.P. has demonstrated the

actual position through map of district Nausheroferoze. The

contention of the learned counsel for the petitioner that

between Tappa Luthi and Tappa Mithiani constituency PS-35

has been created which is misconceived assertion. The map

placed before us by the E.C.P's representative in presence of

learned counsel for the petitioner unequivocally shows that in

PS-35 Nausheroferoze-III Tappa Luthi and Tappa Mithiani

both are included. No other issue has been raised. We are

satisfied that while including the aforesaid two Tappas in PS-

35, the Delimitation Committee as well as the E.C.P taken

due care not to disturb the population of geographically

compact areas, existing boundaries of administrative units,

facilities of communication and public convenience. No issue

raised that the delimitation was not started from the Northern

end of district and failed to proceed clockwise in zigzag

manner so that population among the constituencies shall

remain as close as may be practicable to the quota. At this

stage no interference is warranted. We dismissed the petition

vide our short order dated 21.06.2018. Above are the reasons

for our short order.
