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After hearing the counsels at length, it seems that this constitutional petition has

no merits while the claim of the tenant is that rent has been paid in another matter

pending before the learned Rent Controller, the orders of the courts below are sustainable

on the ground of personal bonafide need. The trial Court gave 60 days' time to the tenant

to vacate the premises; however, he preferred appeal before the appellate forum where

the judgment came on 18.08.2018 giving 30 more days.

In these circumstances, this petition is dismissed alongwith listed applications.

However, the petitioner is given 90 days' time from today to vacate the premises, as well

as, directed to make an application before the Rent Controller to have the rents deposited

under previous rent applications released to the legal heirs of the landlord, upon later's

filing of appropriate legal entitlement documents.
