On the last date of hearing i.e. 20.01.2020, while issuing notice to the Respondents, as interim measures, following order was passed:-

“Issue notice to the Respondents. Counter affidavit, if any, may be filed before the next date. However, till the next date of hearing the services of Inspector General of Police, Sindh shall not be surrendered without consultation of the Federal Government in terms of Article 12 (2) of the Sindh (Repeal of the Police Act, 1861 and Revival of Police Order, 2002) (Amendment) Act, 2019. Adjourned to 28.01.2020.”

In the main Petition, the Petitioners have prayed for restraining orders against the Respondents No.1 to 5 not to remove or suspend or surrender the services of the Respondent No.6 in violation of Article 12 (2) of the Sindh (Repeal of the Police Act, 1861 and Revival of Police Order, 2002) (Amendment) Act, 2019.

After hearing the preliminary arguments of the learned counsel for the Petitioners, we had passed the interim order. Today, learned Advocate General, Sindh appeared and clearly given a statement that no

action shall be taken for removing the Inspector General of Police, Sindh in violation of Article 12 (2) of the Sindh (Repeal of the Police Act, 1861 and Revival of Police Order, 2002) (Amendment) Act, 2019.

In view of the statement of the learned Advocate General, Sindh, the stay application is disposed of with the directions that no violation of Article 12 (2) of the Sindh (Repeal of the Police Act, 1861 and Revival of Police Order, 2002) (Amendment) Act, 2019 will be committed by the Respondents No.1 to 5.
