<u>ORDER</u>

Agha Faisal, **J**. The petitioner, representing herself to be employed by JPMC, has assailed a notification dated 17.12.2021, whereby the respondent no. 9 was transferred / posted. At the very onset, learned counsel was confronted as to the maintainability hereof, *inter alia*, in view of the issue of *laches* and petitioner having been unable to demonstrate as to how she befell within the definition of an aggrieved person.

- 2. The counsel could not surmount the issue of delay and further remained unable to demonstrate any right of the petitioner enabling her to approach this Court. *Prima facie* the issue appears to be that of a private dispute as the concerned respondent is stated to be the in charge of the department whereat the petitioner renders her services. The allegations against the concerned respondent, albeit bald and unsubstantiated, could not be entertained in the writ jurisdiction in any event as adjudication of disputed questions of fact, requiring detailed inquiry, appreciation of evidence etc., is unmerited¹.
- 3. In view hereof, we find this petition to be misconceived, hence, the same, along with pending application/s, was dismissed *in limine* vide our short order announced in Court at the conclusion of the hearing earlier today. These are the reasons for our short order.
