It is alleged that the applicant and others issued two cheques

worth rupees twenty-two lacs in favour of complainant Sohail

Ibrahim, which were bounced by the concerned bank when were

presented there for encashment, for which the present case was

registered.

The applicant, on refusal of pre-arrest bail by learned XIII-

Additional Sessions Judge, Karachi East, has sought the same from

this Court by making the instant bail application u/s 498 Cr.P.C.

Heard arguments and perused the record.

The FIR of the incident has been lodged with a delay of more

than one month; such delay could not be overlooked. The parties are

disputed over the sale and purchase of the property. The subject

cheques have not been issued by the applicant. The offence alleged

against the applicant does not fall within the prohibitory clause. The

punishment which the alleged offence entails is imprisonment for

three years or a fine; if the applicant after the due trial is awarded the

punishment of fine only then the imprisonment which he is likely to undergo on account of the refusal of pre-arrest bail to him would be somewhat extra. The case has finally been challaned. The applicant has joined the trial and there is no allegation of misusing the concession of interim pre-arrest bail on his part. In these circumstances, a case for grant of pre-arrest bail to the applicant on the point of further inquiry and malafide is made out.

In view of the above, while relying upon the case of *Noman Khaliq v. the State* (2023 *SCMR* 2122), the interim pre-arrest bail already granted to the applicant is confirmed on the same terms and conditions.

Instant bail application is disposed of accordingly.
