ORDER

Agha Faisal, J. The plaintiff, admittedly a civil servant serving in the Federal Board of Revenue, has essentially challenged his transfer orders vide this suit. Earlier another suit filed by the same plaintiff in similar circumstances has already been determined, being Suit No. 720 of 2024.

The plaintiff's learned counsel was confronted of maintainability inter alia as to how a matter pertaining to terms and conditions of service of civil servants may be agitated in a civil suit; in view of the bar contained in Article 212 of the Constitution as appreciated by the Supreme Court in Ali Azhar Baloch¹, however, he remained unable to do so.

This court has determined a similar matter, Nasser Janjua2, and in mutatis mutandis application of the reasoning and rationale assigned therein it is observed that the grievance of the plaintiff could not be adjudicated in a civil suit; in view of the bar contained in Article 212 of the Constitution, as interpreted by the Supreme Court from time to time; including in Ali Azhar Baloch³. Therefore, the plaint is hereby rejected per Order VII rule 11(d) CPC⁴
