Through this petition, the petitioner seeks quashment of FIR bearing Crime No. 41/2025 registered at Police Station Nangarparkar under Sections 506(2), 147, 148, 149, 504, 337-A(i), and 337-F(i) PPC, primarily on the ground that the FIR has been falsely registered due to a dispute over landed property with respondent No.7. It is contended that the allegations are baseless, general in nature, and intended only to harass the petitioner.

Learned counsel for the petitioner argues that the FIR has been registered with mala fide intent, solely to pressurize the petitioner in relation to a civil dispute. He submits that the allegations are baseless and do not constitute any offence, hence, the FIR is liable to be quashed.

We have heard the learned counsel and examined the material available on record.

It is a settled principle of law that quashment of FIR at a premature stage is not warranted unless the FIR on the face of it does not disclose commission of any cognizable offence or is patently mala fide. In the present case, the allegations levelled in the FIR prima facie disclose the elements of cognizable offences, which require investigation. The truth or falsity of such allegations can only be determined after a thorough investigation by the competent authority.

No exceptional ground has been made out by the petitioner to warrant interference of this Court in constitutional jurisdiction. Accordingly, we find no merit in this petition, which stands dismissed in *limine*.
