ORDER

RIAZAT ALI SAHAR, J.- Through this petition, petitioner Zulfiqar Ali @ Muhammad Nawaz (Chori) prays for the following relief(s) :

- (a) *That, this Honourable Court may be pleased to direct the official respondents NJo.3 to 5 to conduct the inquiry and take departmental action against respondent No.2, as he has misused his official power and as he has involved the innocent persons, further may be pleased to direct the respondents No.3 to 5 and discharge the names of petitioner and his brothers from wanted list.*
- (b) *That this Honourable Court may be pleased to direct the official respondents to not register any false F.I.R against the family members of petitioner without any justification and further may be pleased to direct the officials to provide legal protection to petitioner and his family members in accordance with law.*
- (c) *That, this Honourable Court may be pleased to direct the respondent No.6 to submit report regarding petitioner and his brother namely Sarfraz Ali before this Honourable Court.*

Perusal of the record reveals that, on 13.11.2025, subject to the maintainability, notices were ordered to be issued to the respondents. In compliance thereof, Inspector Anwar Ali Abro, SHO, Police Station Warah (respondent No.2), submitted his statement on 28.11.2025, wherein he categorically stated that the petitioner, as well as his near relatives, are involved in several criminal cases. He also furnished a list of criminal cases registered against the petitioner, which is reproduced as under:

1. *Crime No.18/2021 under sections 17/1 HO of Police Station Warrah.*
2. *Crime No.131/2021 under sections 17/3 HO of Police Station Warrah.*
3. *Crime No.02/2015 under sections 402, 399, 324, 353, 148, 149, PPC of Police Station Warrah.*
4. *Crime No.03/2015 under sections 412 PPC of Police Station Warrah.*
5. *Crime No.04/2015 under sections 23 (i) S.A.A of Police Station Warrah.*
6. *Crime No.07/2017 under sections 324, 353, 402, 399, PPC of Police Station Warrah.*
7. *Crime No.04/2015 under sections 23 (i) S.A.A of Police Station Warrah.*
8. *Crime No.02/2015 under sections 402, 399, 148, 149, PPC of Police Station Gaji Khuhawar.*
9. *Crime No.03/2015 under sections 412, PPC of Police Station Gaji Khuhawar.*
10. *Crime No.04/2015 under sections 23(i) (a) SAA 2013 of Police Station Gaji Khuhawar.*

Today, neither the petitioner nor his counsel is in attendance. The record further reflects that, despite being involved in a number of criminal cases, the petitioner has approached this Court seeking, *inter alia*, protection from the respondents. It is also stated by respondent No.2 that the aforesaid cases have been challaned, meaning thereby that the matters are already pending adjudication before the different competent Courts.

The record does not disclose any material demonstrating that the petitioner is being subjected to any unlawful harassment or that the respondents are acting beyond the scope of their lawful authority. On the contrary, the material placed on record indicates that the criminal cases referred to by respondent No.2 have proceeded in accordance with law.

Moreover, a person involved in criminal cases cannot, merely by invoking a general apprehension of harassment, seek blanket protection so as to obstruct or frustrate the lawful investigation or prosecution of cases registered against him.

In view of the above circumstances, the instant petition appears to be misconceived and devoid of any lawful basis. The petitioner has failed to make out any case warranting interference by this Court or grant of the relief sought by him. Consequently, the instant petition, being misconceived and not maintainable, is hereby dismissed.
