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Learned counsel for the KPT informs that there are more than 50 cases of identical nature. The grievance of the Plaintiff is that they may not be dispossessed without due course of law. He has referred to order dated 17.2.2009, whereby according to him the case could have been disposed of. However, it is being delayed due to long list of lawyers and on the every date of hearing some of the lawyers remain absent, therefore, cases are discharged or adjourned. He has also informed that most of the Plaintiffs do not have lease hold rights in respect of their property for which they have filed suit, therefore, in the first place Mr. Sarfaraz Sulhery, counsel for the Defendant is directed to file detailed list of the cases in which the Plaintiffs having no lease hold right or their leases have expired and then office will bifurcate cases in which leases are intact in two different bunches. The bunch of case in which leases have been

expired will be taken up on different dates and bunch of cases in which lease subsists on different dates it will be decided according to the merits. This exercise to be done by the learned counsel for the KPT within one week and office is directed after examining list so provided by the counsel to fix the cases in which leases have already been expired on 10.3.2015 and second bunch in which leases are still in existence on 11.3.2015. These cases will be taken up at 11:00 a.m and no adjournment will be granted and appropriate order will be passed on the basis of available record.

Interim order passed earlier to continue till the next date of hearing.
